550 S Central Ave
 (previous to 1941, 524 S Central Ave,
 or included with 526 S Central Ave)

Built in 1920 as the Franklin-Ritt Garage, it incorporated the existing building at 526 S Central into its design. It has been the home to such businesses as The Franklin-Ritt Co., its successor the Franklin-Marshfield Co., Stewart-Galvin Battery Co., S & S Chevrolet, Hub City Bowling Lanes and the Ten Pin Tap (bar), Center City Lanes, Ray's Mainstreet Lanes, and Heinzen Printing.
